- Roman Road SSSI Cutting, popping, racking, burning. All in a day's work for the Midweek team! The quality of the species rich chalk grassland is testament to the hard work carried out by the team over the years.

- 25th CHRISTMAS DAY NO TASK




Directions to work sites


Barnwell East LNR - Meet at the reserve entrance on Uphall Road, off Coldhams Lane.
