<p>1. Cuckoos lay eggs that copy the eggs of other birds. This is called 'egg mimicry'.</p> <p>See if you can find some pictures of real bird eggs and then have a go at copying them, either by drawing or painting.</p>	<p>1. A cuckoo chick is much larger than the bird that rears it.</p> <p>See if you can find some pictures of a cuckoo chick in its nest.</p> <p>Can you remember from the video why the host bird carries on feeding the alien chick?</p>	<p>1. Cuckoos and their hosts are locked into what is known as an 'evolutionary arms race'</p> <p>See if you can find out what this means.</p> <p>Can you find any other examples of evolutionary arms races in nature?</p>
<p>2. Some scientists think that the cuckoo looks like a sparrow hawk to scare little birds away from their nests.
