B – East, about 1¾ miles (2.8 km)*, allow 1hr

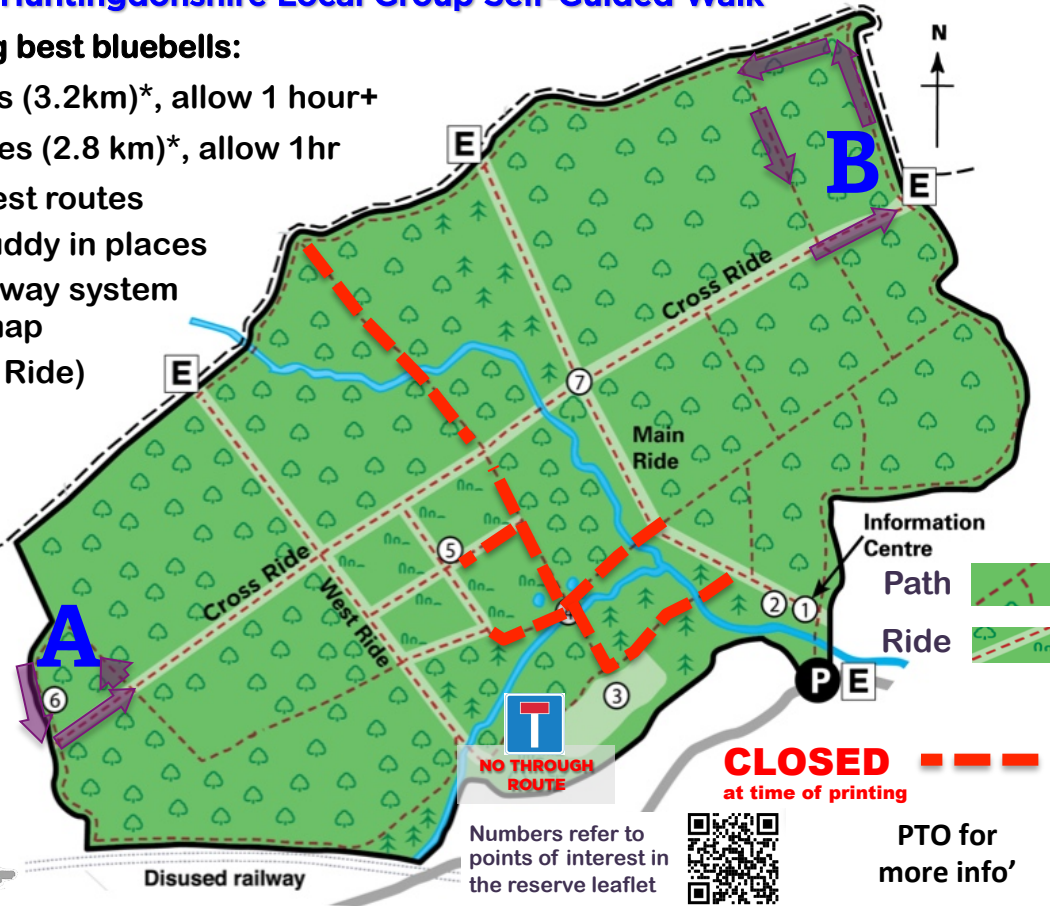

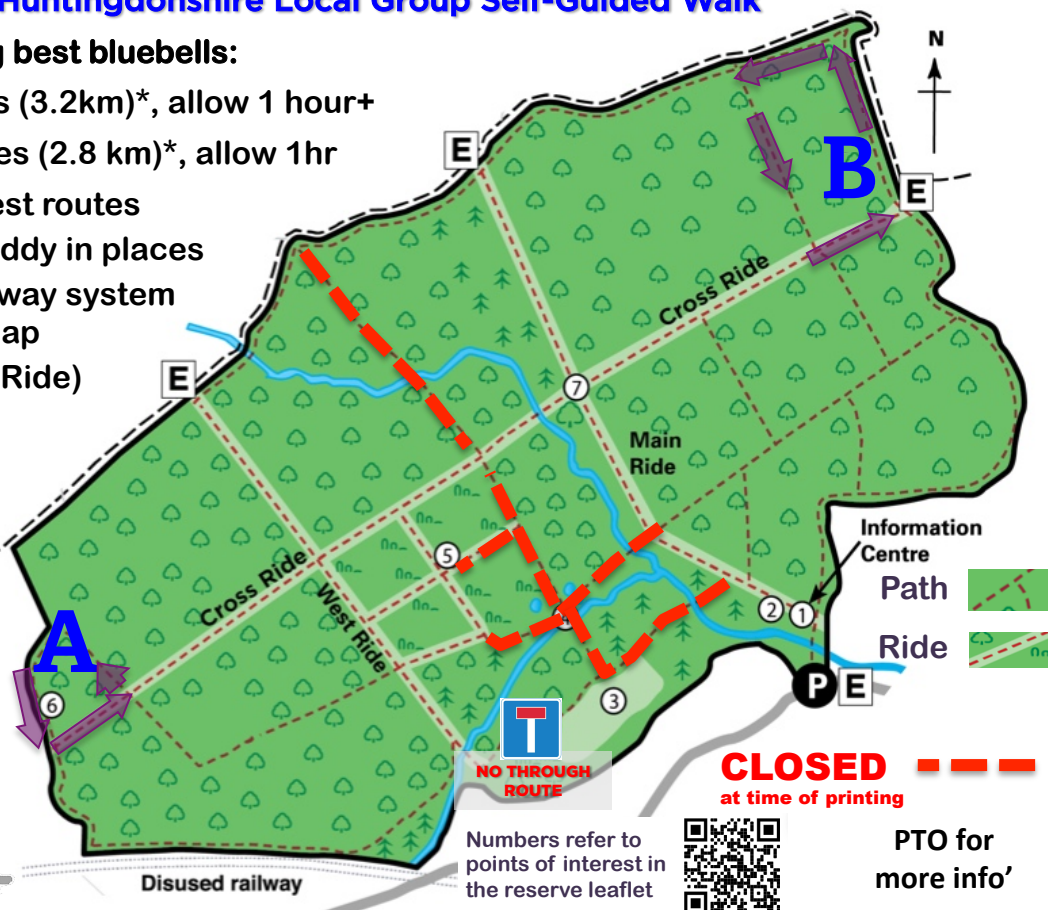
