Adventure trail

You can do this in any green space which has trees and water. You will need a pencil and some crayons. Or you can enjoy your walk and do the activities when you get home.

1 Find a tree

Trees might seem boring and bare in winter but they are actually already getting ready for spring. Look closely and you may find some buds on the branches. Use the ID sheet in this pack and see if you can identify what kind of tree it is.

2 Spot an animal

Stand quietly for a few minutes and observe what's around you. Can you hear anything? See if you can spot a bird or a mammal – they can be easier to see at this time of the year because the trees have lost their leaves so animals have fewer places to hide. You can also use the spotter sheet in this pack.

3 Make some nature art

Can you can find fallen leaves, twigs, berries and more and make a piece of nature art using things you've found on the ground?

Can you find the following:



- 5. A nature noise






