What is the Upper Nene Valley Gravel Pit SPA?

The Upper Nene Valley Gravel Pits are a series of lakes and wetlands that have been created from former gravel extractions. Now these areas that have shallow and deep waters and lots of islands and grass are perfect for certain bird species to rest and feed in the winter.

There are a few of these gravel pits in the Nene Valley, including Rushden Lakes, Stanwick Lakes, Northampton Washlands, Summer Leys and Titchmarsh Nature Reserves, as well as others.



From October to March over 20,000 waterbirds from places like Iceland, Scandinavia and Russia migrate to the Upper Nene Valley Gravel Pit SPA. There are lots of plants, fish, worms and insects living here that are perfect for these hungry birds to feed on.

It is important that these birds can feed over the winter in order to survive. Sometimes these birds are disturbed by dogs off of leads, people walking and cycling off of the paths, watersports and fishing.

We can help these birds to stick around and eat well by sticking to paths, staying away from nesting and feeding birds, keeping dogs on leads in the SPA, and fishing only in designated areas.






